Sankardev a Mahavidyalay a was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institute of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal

sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration, inspite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people. This college has been striving towards an advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. This is a single faculty i.e. Arts College imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. We have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources. The college in its endeavour towards better academic

environment has a UGC Network Resource Centre and Computer

The college has an Information and Career Guidance Cell (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures and supplying formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established separate specialized study centre for research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures.

These two Centres are Sankardeva Study and Research Centre (SSRC) and Tribal Development Centre (TDC).

The college has also a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar and number of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. The college is a member of Sydney based International NGO "Clean-up the World". The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made

through supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the NAAC awarded "B" Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resources.



Department of Education has extensively used this technique and has got quite good result. Because, here students become more conversant with a particular topic and so comprehend easily. effectiveness, micro-teaching has been generalized in our

institution.

- 2. Objective of the Practice:-
 - It has been introduced with certain objectives.
 - i. In Micro-teaching, a particular chapter is divided into small segments. Consequently; students get it easy to comprehend a single idea than a whole chapter.
 - ii. Here, attention is focused on specific teaching skills such
 - as lecturing, questioning, explaining, demonstration etc.
 - as students have to follow the above skill, they become



more expertise in subject matters and also become proficient in speaking.

The Practice:-4.

> Teachers of respective departments select some topics and ask a group of students with a group leader to get prepared on the chosen topic. The leader as well as the group is given a certain period of time for preparation. On due day, the group leader accompanied by the group will provide a lession to the whole class on the given topic. After teaching, there is an interaction session. Here co-students put questions and the group leader

- with the group in general answers those questions. The concerned teacher anchors here and interfieres whenever it is urgent. Particul: y une teachers make necessary rectification whenever it is necessary.

Class-observation is a system of evaluation of the teachers based on a prescribed format to test the effectiveness of teaching and performance of the concerned teacher in the Classroom cituation. The Principal would either directly observe the class or depute the vice-Principal or some academician from other institutions for the purpose. Objective of the Practice:-With a view to the fulfillment of the following objectives, this Practice has been launchedi. To evaluate the teacher's ability and performance in the class and to judge their shortcomings. ii. To suggest and prescribe the necessary measures to

improve their qualities of teaching.

iii. To provide better and effective teaching to the students.



4. The Practice:-

Every teacher while engaging the classes is to be assessed and evaluated on the basis of the criteria mentioned in the prescribed format. The observer without prior information will enter the class once in a week in order to evaluate the specific teacher at the time of teaching. The observer will award the teacher with deserving grades which will help in rectifying his methods of teaching as per the students' requirements.

No obstac's has been faced till date by the observer in this process.

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The teachers become prompt, enthusiastic and alert to face such surprise observations. They give up their lethargy and habit of procrastination. Even the students are highly benefited as the teachers try to disseminate the best teaching materials possible for them.




examination some other common pragrammes such as plantation, cultural programme, educational tour and games & sports are performed.
