College Background:

Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institute of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration. In spite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people, this college has been striving towards an advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. This is a single faculty i.e. Arts College imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. We have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources.

The college in its endeavour towards better academic environment has a UGC Network Resource Centre and Computer Centre conducting two certificate courses viz. of three months and one year respectively. We have built a well furnished library and procured a good number of books. We have two vocational courses- one in Functional English (Sanctioned by UGC) and the other in Computer Application.

The college has an "Information and Career Guidance Cell" (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures and supply formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established separate centre for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. These two centre are Sankardeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.

The college has a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar and number of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. the college is a member of Sydney based International NGO "Clean-up the World". The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made through supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the NAAC awarded "B" Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resources.

The target which we have achieved so far is mentioned below;

1. We have organize two numbers of National Seminar and two numbers of Intra-campus seminar and one three days workshop:

(a). National Seminar:

i. A National Seminar on the topic “Best Practices in the Higher Education for quality development” was held on 14th Oct’06 sponsored by the NAAC. Dr. K.G. Battacharjee, Director of Academic Staff College, Guwahati University was the Resource Person and Mr. Siva Sharma, Retd. Principal, Madhab dev College, Narayanpur was presided over the seminar in where 17 Nos. of paper were presented by the participants coming from various colleges.

ii. Another National Seminar was held on 25th Nov’06 on the topic “*Globalization and its impact on the National Economy of India*”.

The inaugural session of the Seminar was started with a chorus presented by the college musical team. Then, the welcome address was read out by Mr. B.N. Bhagowati, Vice-principal, Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya. Fr. Andrew, Principal, St. Xavier School, Harmutty delivered a speech as the inaugurator of the Seminar. The keynote of the Seminar was read by Mr. Mohendra Bora, Principal, Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya. In his speech, he had expressed deep sense of gratitude to all the guests, invites, resource persons and the participants.

The first technical session was begun under the chairmanship of Dr. L. Borgohain, Principal, L.T.K College, Lakhimpur. Prof. Jayanta Kr. Gogoi, Dept. of Economics, Dibrugarh University participated as Resource person with his paper on the title “*Globalization, Indian Economy, and Regional Disparity in*

India with special reference to North-Eastern Region". Three valuable papers were presented by the participants in the Pre-lunch session.

The second technical session was conducted under the chairmanship of Dr. I. Sarma Bharali, Principal, Madhabdev College, Narayanpur. Mr. Lijum Nochi, Lecturer, Deptt. Of Economics, Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh presented a valuable paper on "*Handloom and Handicraft: Exports in perspective of NORTH-EAST INDIA*". The remaining four papers were presented in this session.

An interaction session was opened to all the participants for the further query. Mr. Utpal Deka of Bihpuria College, and Mr. Probin Bora of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya presents the Rapporteur Report in the August house.

(b). Intra-campus Seminar:

i. Intra-campus seminar is a student based seminar where students take part as a paper presenter as well as participants. The first Intra-campus seminar of this session was organized by IQAC on 13th Oct'06 on the topic "*Value based education*". In this seminar 7 Nos. of student participants presented their papers on the topic mentioned.

Mr. Arun Kr. Goswami, HOD, Assamese of our college was the Resource Person who analyzed and explained the subject matter to the students in a convenient manner.

ii. A one day seminar on the topic "*Corruption, its impact on individual, society and institutions*" was held in our college on 1st of Nov'06, organized by IQAC in association with Assam Gramin Vikash Bank, Borbali Branch, Lakhimpur. Mr. Mohendra Bora, Principal of our college participated as Resource Person, where 100 Nos. of Self Help Group (SHG) members joined as participants.

(c). Workshop:-

A three day workshop was held on 23rd Nov'06 to 25th Nov'06 in our college under the supervision of District Rastriya Sama Vikash Yojana. The theme of the workshop was "Cross breed cow and its production", Where District Veterinary Officer was Co-ordinator and Add. Deputy Commissioner Lakhimpur participated as Resource Person, where 40 participants of 4 Self Help Groups joined as participants.

2. The college applied for introduction of two numbers of Vocational Courses.

3. Silver Jubilee Celebration:

The inaugural ceremony of silver jubilee of our college was organized on 5th Sept'06. A colourful ceremonial function was held to Commemorate 25 years of glorious past of the college. On the occasion the Hon'ble Cabinet minister Govt. of Assam Mr. Bharat Ch. Narah, Hon'ble M.P. Tezpur Constituency Mr. M.K. Subba, Hon'ble M.L.A. Bihpuria Constituency Mr. B. Borah, Hon'ble Director of Higher Education Arunachal Pradesh Mr. J. Begi, Deputy Commissioner & Superintendent of Police Lakhimpur district and various dignitaries attended the function and delivered lectures on the occasion. Thousand of local people, Ex-teachers, Ex-students of the college participated enthusiastically.

4. A Group Discussion:

A group discussion was organized by the Deptt. of History on the topic "Tourism and its problem and prospect of North-east India". Total number of 35 students were present in the same and 15 students took active part, where a good number of teachers were present in the discussion.

5. Career counseling is going on regularly through Information and Career Guidance Cell (ICGC) of the College to B.A.-II & B.A.-III Year students regarding higher education, job, competitive exams and enterprise building spirit.

6. The process of Micro-teaching has been launched on experimental basis for the all round development of the students. The teachers of entire Departments & all the

students involve themselves for the success of the system. At least two classes of each Department are observed by the Principal of the college and proper advice is given to the teachers of the observed classes for further rectifications.

Part B:

I. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The College authority has set up total twelve numbers of well defined goals for the all-round development of the College as well as the local people of the catchments area.

In the very beginning of the session, to make the students efficient, useful and responsible citizen, the teachers of the various departments of the college, deliver the lectures to the students in their respective classes.

To develop the knowledge of civic responsibilities among the students, the college arranges Intra-campus seminars and Group discussions in association with Eco-political Forum of our College. Apart from these, the department of Political Science of the College has also taken such initiatives in their Major and Core classes.

The College organizes Seminars, Workshops, Entrepreneurship Development Programme such as industry, Fishery and Animal Husbandry for the development of the skill of the students to produce self-reliant individuals and to promote the knowledge of their aesthetic sense.

To bring the importance of social harmony, integration and enhancement in overall socio-cultural aspects of the students, the college organizes Inter-district and All Assam Classical Songs (Borgeet) Competition in every year in association with College student's Union and Sankardeva Study and Research Centre. More over, the reputed scholars are invited to deliver the valuable lectures on social-harmony, integration and also the contributions of Sankardeva and his disciple Madhabdeva for the Assamese people.

To create the awareness among the students about the glorious past of the human society, we have taught our students in association with the Department of

History and *Natya Charcha* (Drama Section) of our College by organizing Group Discussion and staging historical drama.

For the awareness about the ecology and environment, the College teaches the Degree students through the Environmental studies course, which is a compulsory subject for the Degree second year class.

To give emphasis on value based education, to bring about morally sound individuals, the college arranges Intra-Campus seminars in collaboration with the Department of Assamese and Sankardeva Study and Research Centre of the College. To bring the feelings and sense of Nationalism, the College observes the National and important days in colourful manner.

Apart from these observed days, the Department of Hindi observes the "Hindi Divas" in every year.

To promote international understanding and for the development of communication skill in regional, national and international languages, the College organizes seminars on teaching and learning of English languages on Secondary level in association with the Department of English.

Through Tribal Development Centre (TDC), we survey the Socio-economic aspects of the tribal people of our feeder area.

Through the Eco-political Forum of the College, we discuss the burning issues of the present scenario, by organizing Group Discussion and Intra-campus Seminar.

23. Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feed back:

The student assessment on teachers is introduced on all the degree classes (Both Major & Core). The feed back collected through an appraisal report of the students are verified and the remarks made by them are recorded. The teachers are intimated individually to rectify the method of teaching and to establish rapport with the students. Some times, they are collectively intimated in the staff meeting and both good & bad aspects are discussed in an amiable atmosphere. The authority also informs the head of the Departments to keep an eye on the teachers and rectify what ever needed within a specific period of time.
