College Background:

Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institute of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration. In spite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people, this college has been striving towards an advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. This is a single faculty i.e. Arts College imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. We have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources.

The college, in its endeavour towards better academic environment, has a UGC Network Resource Centre and Computer Centre conducting two certificate courses viz. of three months and one year respectively. We have built a well furnished library and procured a good number of books. We have two vocational courses- one in Functional English (Sanctioned by UGC) and the other in Computer Application. We have built an auditorium measuring 125 X 45 sq.ft. by the grants-in-aid from Planning and Development Govt. of Assam

and a Mini museum measuring 1800 sq.ft was built by the grants-inaid from the Department of WPT&BC, Govt. of Assam.

The college has an "Information and Career Guidance Cell" (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures, formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established separate centre for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. These two centres are Sankardeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.

The college has a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar and number of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. The college is a member of Sydney based International NGO "Clean-up the World". The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made thorough supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the NAAC awarded "B" Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resources.

It is our immense pleasure that the college has already crossed its silver jubilee year, so we celebrated our college silver jubilee celebration from 18th Dec'08 to 20th Dec'08. Colourful programmes were displayed and several dignitaries attended in the open session of the closing ceremony.

Saikia Memorial Lecture Series. The topic of the workshop was "Problems and prospect of self employment in North-East Region". Mr. Iswar Sarmah Bhorali, Principal, Madhabdev College, Narayanpur, Lakhimpur presided over the session. It was inaugurated by Dr. Umaram Tamuli, Associate Professor, Lakhimpur College of Veterinary Science. Dr. Tamuli praised vehemently to the organizer for selecting a burning topic for discussion. He extended thanks to the organizer for inviting renowned intellectual Sri Ismail Hussain, Sr. Lecturer, Assam Engineering Institute, Guwahati, writer of more than fifty books as a Resource Person to the workshop. Dr. Tamuli superficially throws light to the topic and its grand importance for the day and anticipated a juicy outcome from the workshop.

The speaker for the first session was Sri Ismail Hussain and he thoroughly discussed the problems and prospects of self employment in North-East Region. He elaborated that in the midst of problems for self employment; we have to be optimistic and have to search the right area for self employment. He pointed out for instance that "Asomiya Gamucha" has great demand in every day but this demand could not be met up by our own product. She has to bring Gamucha from other states like Orissa, Chennai etc, where is Assamese weavers are quite expert in producing handloom textiles.

Another sector for self employment, Sri Hussain indicates in the field of Floriculture. Flowers, flower garlands are used in every

religious and other formal activity of the North-eastern states. Unfortunately, seven sisters could not produce that requisite flowers itself and solely depends on Bengal market. So he urged the new generation to concentrate on floriculture and there by to stand independently and produce as much flower as possible. Some other areas he pointed out were production of fish, eggs, chickens etc. North-east region has many resources and a suitable environment for Fish culture. Still she has to bring numerous tones of fishes from out side the state. Then he pointed out cane and bamboo made furniture, utensil etc. cane and bamboo are easily available raw materials and these raw materials could be converted to valuable products with the help of proper expertise & finance. For all these needs proper awareness, motivation, financial and technical assistance from concern Govt. and Semi-Govt. agencies. Sri Hussain requested to the Director of D.I.C.C. to talk about technical and financial assistance a way of achieving all them. Moreover, he explained about the sericulture, Muga, Pat & endi etc.

A 15 minutes tea break observed and then started the second session of the workshop. Hon'ble Deputy General Manager, DICC Mr.G.Gogoi Lakhimpur joined as Resource Person. He suggested organizing training programme from time to time among the educated unemployed youth. Specially, he elaborated the importance of SHGs with reference to Bangladesh. He repeated the key areas for self-employment mentioned by Sri Hussain and asked the assembled participants to proceed with a desired goal and proper planning – money is not the obstruction – there is the bank, DRDA, DIC, SIRD, NEC, & many voluntary organizations that are ready to help such determined and energetic people. He coated from Hussain's speech – Sri Hussain brought a traditional dress from a particular North-east

tribe to store at British museum, London. On his way, onlooker offered him up to Rs. 10,000.00 for the dress he took. If a traditional dress could fetch such a huge amount then it certainly good news – Traditional dresses of so many tribes of North-east region could certainly grab the international market. With these Sri Gogoi concluded his speech.

i. Manuscript

The "Manuscript" which itself means "a hand written documents by the author". In ancient Assam, i.e. in 15th century onwards, the great philosopher and religious leader Smt. Sankardeva and his disciples were devoted themselves to preach the doctrines of Neo-Vashinavism in entire North-east. For this purpose, they wrote hundreds of "SANCHIPOTIA PUTHI" (Scripts written on Sanchipat) in a very scientific way, which are now scattered through out the region. Due to lack of proper preservation, those Manuscripts are totally or partially damaged.

Keeping all these view in mind, Sankardeva Study & Research Centre established in our college to collect and preserve the manuscript for further research. Although, the task is difficult enough, the Sankardeva Study & Research Centre has collected 14 Nos. of old manuscripts for preservation and research work.

An Assam type building, measuring 1800 sq.ft. has been completed so far for the purpose of establishment of one mini museum in the fond memory of late B.K. Saikia, the pioneer of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya from the Grants-in-Aid offered by WPT & BC Govt. of Assam. The necessary arrangement for the said mini museum could not be done so far due to financial problem.

ii. The computerization of Central Library of the College is in progress in the SOUL Package, supplied by Information and Library Network Centre (INFLIBNET) Ahmedabad. The process of computerization of Central Library could not be done in first due to shortage of technical personality.

On his way, onlooker offered him upto Rs. 10,000.00 for the dress he took. With these Sri Gogoi concluded his speech.

Now its time for Chairperson Speech. Hon'ble Dr. Iswar sharma Bhorali appealed the young enthusiastic people to avail the facilities and scope discuss in the platform. The session was concluded after the vote of thanks offered by the college authority.

vii. Group discussion:

A). Department of English of our college, organized a group discussion on 15th Sept'2008 among a cluster of brilliant students on the topic "Drama as true representation of Society". Two teachers of said Dept. observed the proceedings of discussion and encouraged the students for free display of their knowledge.
