## **College Background:**

*Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya was established at Pathalipahar in the year 1982 by the efforts of local inhabitants who felt the urgency of an institute of higher education in the locality. Pathalipahar, a rural tribal sub-plan area, is located at the border of Assam and Arunachal Pradesh as a centre of integration. In spite of utter backwardness of the area and poverty of its people, this college has been striving towards an advancement and progress in all directions since its inception. This is a single faculty i.e. Arts College imparting higher education in nine subjects of Social Science and Humanities to the poor and needy students for whom higher education is a dream and beyond reach. We have already done a lot by the assistance of UGC and other sources.*

*The college, in its endeavour towards better academic environment, has a UGC Network Resource Centre and Computer Centre conducting two certificate courses viz. of three months and one year respectively. We have built a well furnished library and procured a good number of books. We have two vocational courses- one in Functional English (Sanctioned by UGC) and the other in Computer Application. We have built an auditorium measuring 125 X 45 sq.ft. by the grants-in-aid from Planning and Development Govt. of Assam*

*and a Mini museum measuring 1800 sq.ft was built by the grants-in-aid from the Department of WPT&BC, Govt. of Assam.*

*The college has an "Information and Career Guidance Cell" (ICGC) to provide information to the students about different courses, admission procedures, formats and advertisement of jobs in various sectors. The college has established separate centre for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral-tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. These two centres are Sankardeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.*

*The college has a band of young, energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are actively participative in both academic and community oriented activities. That is why we have already organized National Seminar and member of National environmental awareness campaigns, AIDS awareness campaigns, Medical camps etc. The college is a member of Sydney based International NGO "Clean-up the World". The college had applied voluntarily to NAAC for Assessment and Accreditation. The NAAC Peer team visited the college and made thorough supervision on the basis of SSR prepared by the college. After being satisfied, the NAAC awarded "B" Grade to us, which is another milestone in the history of this rural college with limited resources.*

*It is our immense pleasure that the college has already crossed its silver jubilee year, so we celebrated our college silver jubilee celebration from 18<sup>th</sup> Dec '08 to 20<sup>th</sup> Dec '08. Colourful programmes were displayed and several dignitaries attended in the open session of the closing ceremony.*

**iv. Organization of national seminar/intra-campus seminar:**

**(a). National Seminar:**

A two day National Seminar sponsored by University Grants Commission in collaboration with the Eco-Political Forum of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya, Pathalipahar was held on 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> September '2009 on the topic "Menace of population pressure and its impact of environment and economy". Altogether 48 participants with papers, which included research scholars and students participants from different institution of Assam and outside also. Altogether 25 Nos. of papers were presented in the two days National Seminar, a great numbers of participants like academician, intellectual, students and a good number of guardians were present on the occasion.

**Inaugural Session:** As per the programme scheduled for the seminar on the first day, the inaugural session was started at 9 am with a well-come song presented by the members of the NATYA CHARCHA and Sankardeva Study and Research Centre of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya. The appointed inaugurator, Dr. Rajen Sabhapandit, Principal of Bihpuria College delivered his inaugural speech with a valuable paper on the main topic. Mr. M. Borah, Principal of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya delivered his keynote address.

**1<sup>st</sup> Business Session:**

The 1<sup>st</sup> Business Session started with the introduction and felicitation to the Resource Persons at 10 am. The Resource Persons present in the Seminar were Prof. Dulal Goswami, an eminent environmental scientist of

Assam and Ex-Professor, Dept. of Geography, Guwahati University, Prof. B.P. Sahu, Head & Associate Professor, Centre for Adult & Continuing Education, NEHU Shillong, Dr. K.S. Rajput, Associate Professor, Deptt. Of Economics, St. Anthony's College, Shillong and Dr. M. Lama, Associate Professor Deptt. Of Economics, Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh. The Co-ordinator of Seminar Organizing Committee presented his well-come address after taking the chair by the chairperson Prof. D. Goswami

In the 1<sup>st</sup> Business Session altogether 6 Nos. of papers were presented. Resource Person Prof. B.P. Sahu delivered his lecture with a valuable paper on the topic of "Population pressure in India and its impact on environment and economy" with statistical presentation. Dr. Prodig Mochahary and Mr. Dilip Kumar Sonowal from Koliabor College, Nagaon presented their paper on the topic "Higher Education in Environmental Awareness amongst the Under-graduate students". Another Resource Person Dr. M. Lama from Rajiv Gandhi University representing Prof. A. Mitra, presented a joint paper on the main topic with a symbolic but mathematical presentation regarding the population effect on environment. After this paper the chairperson Dr. Goswami highlights almost all the parts of the subject matter on the seminar. Mr. Padma Hazarika Research Scholar from NERIST, Arunachal Pradesh presented his paper on the topic "Population pressure and environmental degradation in India: issues of sustainable economic development". He highlights the problems of urbanization and deforestation as a result of rapid growth of population.

**Interaction Session:** After the presentation of 6 (six) valuable papers, the Chairperson declared to open the interaction session for discussion. A good number of general participants as well as students raised different questions on different issues related to the presented papers. The paper



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presenters along with Resource Person and Hon'ble Chairperson have clarified the entire questions raised by the gathering in a fruitful manner.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Business Session:** After the lunch break at 1 pm, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Business Session began at 2 pm with Dr. K.S. Rajput, Associate Professor, St. Anthony's College, Shillong as Chairperson and Professor B.P. Sahu from NEHU and Dr. M. Lama from Rajiv Gandhi University as Resource Persons in this session. Altogether 10 papers were presented. Miss Minti Rani Das, a student from Dhemaji College presented her paper on "Health and environmental quality- A primary drive to build up population as human resource- A case study on Sishiborgaon G.P., Dhemaji District". Mr. Debajit Dutta and Mr. Dulen Kr. Gogoi, Lecturers from Tezpur College jointly presented a paper on the main topic of the seminar. Mrs. Debajani Borah and Mr. Lakhinandan Nath from Laluk College have presented a paper on "Population policies and economy growth". Mr. Khirapad Dutta, Mrs. Latika Hazarika etc. from Madhabdev College have presented a joint paper on "A Hindu approach to environmental issues". Mrs. Mrinali Goswami, Mrs. J. Lahkar Boruah and Mr. H. Hazarika from Lakhimpur Kendriya Mahavidyalaya jointly presented a paper on "Impact of value education in conservation of environment". Mr. Karuna Kt. Mrs. Mitali Boruah and Mrs. Dipti Saikia of Madhabdev College jointly presented a paper on “Global warming, consequences and control measures.” Mr. Bhaskar Doley, Mr. Nikhil Hazarika etc. also from Madhabdev College presented paper on “India’s energy security in the context of global warming and growing population pressure.” Mr. Utpal Saikia and Mr. Probin Kakoti of Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya presented another paper on “Population, environment and sustainable development.” Mrs. Rina Borah, Mr. K.K. #### **v. Group Discussion:**

Department of Assamese of our college organized a group discussion on 19<sup>th</sup> Sept'2009 among a cluster of brilliant students on the topic "Bhakti Literature of Assam in Sankardeva & Madhabdev's period". Two teachers of said Dept. observed the proceedings of discussion and encouraged the students for free display of their knowledge. It was an ideal discussion and students from most of the departments attended the hall.

Five number of active student went through the subject matter and tried their level best to convince the house that the Bhakti literature of Sankardeva & Madhabdev is playing a prominent role in the Assamese society as a whole. The discussion was concluded with a valuable speech from the Chairperson of the house.

**vi. Educational Tour:**

*A joint educational tour was organized by the college to visit Sivsagar and Bhairabkunda, the places of Geographical and Historical importance during the Puja vacation in association with the RC-7 (Seven Rural Base Colleges) of Lakhimpur District, Assam under supervision of the Department of Geography and History of L.T.K. and Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya respectively on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> September'2009. **vii. Community Development Programme:**
