



# 6.3. Quality Improvement Strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Since the college is an affiliated college to Dibrugarh University, Assam; it does not have the autonomy in the curriculum aspects. The curriculum is designed & developed by the affiliating University. Yet each and every department of this college set their own strategies to develop their students.

### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Various quality improvement strategies are adopted by the college in the field of teaching and learning to enhance the efficiency of faculty the members i.e.

- $\checkmark$  Teaching activities are planned through academic calendar.
- ✓ As per the instruction of the College authority, each department formulates and implements its own teaching plans effectively.
- ✓ Faculty members are instructed by the college authority in support of IQAC to engage tutorial and remedial classes for slow learners.
- ✓ To improve the learning habits of the students, departmental seminars, group discussions, work-shops are being organized regularly.
- $\checkmark$  Special class for the weak students.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college authority conducts internal examinations i.e. unit tests, sessional test as per University guidelines. However, other examinations are conducted annually by the college itself.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The college does not have any research council similar to that of a University. But it has its own research committees to help the faculty members especially to encourage them to undertake research activities including Ph. D., M.Phil, Minor and Major Research Projects. However, the college has established separate centre for specialized study, research and development of folk-art, oral tradition, culture and preservation of age-old religious scriptures. It is primarily known as Sankardeva Study and Research Centre and Tribal Development Centre.

#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure/instrumentation

Library is all conventional. Yet, books have been codified. The college has to excel in ICT sector.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The College is a Government provincialized College. As such it needs to follow the academic programmes prescribed by Dibrugarh University. All administrative works are taken up in tune with the guidelines & instructions of Director of Higher Education, Assam. The Principal is the chief executive officer who works under the guidance of Governing Body, the highest management body of the college. Some other committees like Academic Advisory Committee, Library Committee, Examination Committee, and Departmental Management Committee are there in the college which supplements the management of the college.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and staff recruitment

Govt. has set and sanctioned positions in each departments. Faculty is recruited as when vacancy arises in the departments. The recruiting system is also set by the Govt.
