6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Various quality improvement strategies are adopted by the college in the field of teaching and learning to enhance the efficiency of faculty the members i.e.

- ✓ Teaching activities are planned through academic calendar.
- ✓ As per the instruction of the College authority, each department formulates and implements its own teaching plans effectively.
- ✓ Faculty members are instructed by the college authority in support of IQAC to engage tutorial and remedial classes for slow learners.
- ✓ To improve the learning habits of the students, departmental seminars, group discussions, work-shops are being organized regularly.
- ✓ The IQAC tries to improve the student attendance in the classes.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

College follows the Dibrugarh University's schedule for all examinations. Besides, the college holds sessional examinations in its own along with the presentation made by students. The scripts of the final examinations are evaluated by the Dibrugarh University in the various zones set up by it through spot evaluation process. The scripts of the sessional examinations and internal assessment are evaluated internally by the college.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college does not have any research council similar to that of a University. But it has its own research committees to help the faculty members especially to encourage them to undertake research activities including Ph. D. M.Phil, Minor & Major Research Projects.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure/instrumentation

- ✓ The extension of Principal room measuring 45×25 sq.ft is completed in this session from the grants received from the University Grants Commission.
- ✓ The College has completed construction of an Indoor Stadium measuring 100×60 sq. ft. by grants received from University Grants Commission.
- ✓ To attract the new generation, College aspires to establish a Shooting range (Ten miter range for pistol & rifle). Proudly speaking, this is the second shooting range in the North-Eastern India. The total measuring of the range is 100×35 sq. ft. The shooting range is attached with a well-equipped modern gymnastic hall.
- ✓ A two storey building is under construction for the purpose of College canteen.
- ✓ For the improvement of knowledge and skill of computer Education, the college proposed to establish a "Computer and Language Laboratory" with modern software.
- ✓ As the college is situated on hillock, so it is difficult to provide a well and good playground. But the college authority is trying to build up an outdoor stadium in near future.
- ✓ The College authority improved the problem of power supply by setting a Digital Transformer in the college campus with the help of Assam State Electricity Board (ASEB).

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The College is a Government provincialized College. As such it needs to follow the academic programmes prescribed by Dibrugarh University. All administrative works are taken up in tune with the guidelines & instructions of Director of Higher Education, Assam. The Principal is the chief executive officer who works under the guidance of Governing Body, the highest management body of the college. Some other committees like Academic

Advisory Committee, Library Committee, Examination Committee, and Departmental Management Committee are there in the college, which supplements the management of the college.

The college follows the rules and regulations laid down by the State Government for recruitment of faculty members and staffs. No new faculty is appointed during this session, however, one Non-Teaching Staff is appointed in the session.
