

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum is prepared and designed by Dibrugarh University.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- \checkmark Teacher exchange programmes are conducted by the departments of the college.
- ✓ Organized tutor programmes for students.
- ✓ Various student seminars, group discussions, field studies and report writings are conducted.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination and Evaluation is done as per university rules and regulations. Under semester system, examinations are held at an interval of 6 months. In each semester, two sessional examinations are held that are conducted by the college and marks are sent to the Controller of Examination, D.U. For evaluation of final examinations, answer scripts are corrected at the zones, as per the directions of the D.U. Results are prepared and declared by D.U.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college does not have any research council similar to that of University. But the College has its own research committees to help the faculty members especially to encourage them to undertake research activities including Ph. D., M.Phil, Minor and Major projects.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure/instrumentation

- ✓ Proposed to setup at least two smart class rooms: Two well equipped smart class room's setup in the college with internet facilities.
- ✓ Construction of departmental building: A two storey building measuring 80×40 sq. ft. is under construction for the departments of English, Assamese and Economics respectively.
- ✓ Infrastructural development of administrative Block: Two well furnished rooms one for confidential works of Examination and another for Vice Principal of the college are completed in this session.
- ✓ A well equipped computer cum Language Laboratory with 25 no of computer is provided in the college for computer education.

Faculties are entrusted with several committee works along with their regular duties to ensure equal participation of all in all spheres and office works are specified by the Principal, of the college.

The college follows the rules and regulations laid down by the State Government for recruitment of faculty members and staff. No new faculty appointed during the session, however one Non Teaching Staff is appointed during the session.

In each semester, there is a sessional examination of 20/15 marks for each paper in each subject. Reforms are also made in evaluation process. Now the correction of the final examination answer scripts is done in zones and grades are awarded in result-sheets.
