BEST PRACTICE-1

1. Title of the Practice: Eco-friendly Campus

2. Objectives of the Practice: The main objective of the eco-friendly campus is to create a place where friendly practices and education are combined to promote eco-friendly practices in the campus. To create awareness among the students and the staff about the importance of eco-friendly and how to practice it.

3. Context: Sankaradeva Mahavidyalaya is located on a hilltop surrounded by hills and greenery but less efforts were taken to accelerate the idea of eco-friendly practices.

4. Practice:

- (i) Four types of dustbins are installed at different places all over the campus to dispose of different kinds of waste (a) Blue dustbins for dry waste like plastic bottles, food tin, magazines, cardboard, etc i.e. only recyclable waste is dumped. (b) Green dustbin for wet waste like food items, cotton, coffee, tea, peels, etc. (c) Yellow dustbin for non-biodegradable waste such as glass and (d) Black dustbin for non-recyclable items like wipes, menstrual and incontinence pads.
- (ii) A dustbin was constructed near the canteen to deposit all kinds of waste.
- (iii) For new applicants in the college, a sampling needs to be planted in their locality.
- (iv) Many plantations' programs were initiated and implemented.

5. Evidence of Success:

- (i) Awareness was generated among the students and staff about the environment, its importance, and sustainability.
- (ii) It helps to dispose of the waste properly.

6. Problems encountered and resources required

- (i) Training of faculty and students on environment-related course curriculum.
- (ii) Less financial budget to dispose and manage liquid waste, e-waste, etc.

7. Outcome: Successful in its objective as clearly visible in the college campus where the waste is properly disposed of.

1. Title of the Practice: Clean India Campaign 2.0

2. Objectives of the Practice: The main objective was to celebrate and be part of the clean campaign. To create awareness among the local people about the importance of cleanliness and depositing the waste properly.

3. Context: Sankardeva Mahavidyalaya is leading the pack of cleanliness and greenery initiatives. It has also received the Green Champion Award in the Lakhimpur district.

4. Practice: The Institution and NSS unit would lead the campaign in the following manner.

Day-1: Interaction with the locality and creating about the importance of cleanliness. Cleaning the market area, college campus, and college girl's hostel.

Day-2: Cleaning the college playground.

5. Evidence of success

- (i) The people help the NSS unit in cleaning the market area.
- (ii) Campus and the girl's hostel were thoroughly cleaned.
- (iii) The college playground was also cleaned.

6. Problems encountered and resources required

- (i) Some waste garbage is too sticky and deep and difficult to pick it up.
- (ii) Some mechanized tools are required to dig this waste and few wild grasses are so deep rooted very difficult to dig it out with bare hands.

7. Outcome: Successful completion of the campaign and almost 92 kg of plastic has been disposed of. The President of the Gaon Panchayat has praised the institution and the NSS unit for taking the initiative in this campaign and issued a certificate to the NSS volunteers.
